Pittsford: Saturday, February 25, 2017 at the age of 70. Predeceased by his parents, Linwood "Babe" and Mary Nash, sister, Beverly Nash and brother, Douglas "Hawk" Nash. He is survived by his wife of 43 years, Joan (Yorio); daughters, Meredith Nash, Alison Nash (Christopher Burch); grandson, Brayden Simmons; brother, Robert (Joanne) Nash; sisters, Sandy Nash, Barbara (Klaus) Peterson, Bette Nash (Dave DeVos); sister-in-laws, Mary Kay (Glenn) Nolan, Patricia VanScoter, Margaret Yorio; brother-in-law, James (Cathy) Yorio along with several nieces and nephews.
Dave was born in Rochester and grew up in Pittsford where he was better known as Lefty. He graduated from Pittsford High School in 1965. Dave participated in athletics and performed as the lead singer in the rock band The Discords.
Dave was a Vietnam Veteran serving with the 1st Cavalry Division of the United States Army. For his service, he was awarded a Bronze Star, Army Commendation Medal w/V Device for Valor, Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Republic of Vietnam Medal, Presidential Unit Citation and an Army Meritorious Unit Citation.
After his Army Service, Dave became a firefighter with the St. Paul Boulevard Fire Department where he worked for thirty-one years. Dave began his firefighting career as a volunteer with the Pittsford Fire Department and later became a member of the Pittsford Exempts. He also served as the Pittsford Fire Commissioner for two terms.
A Funeral Mass will be held Thursday 10 AM at St. Catherine of Siena Church, 26 Mendon-Ionia Rd., Mendon. A reception will follow in the Monsignor Schnacky Center. Interment will be private. Beginning at 3 PM, a Nash Memorial Bash to celebrate Dave's life will be held at Thirsty's.
